

Jacob served seven years for Rachel, but Laban gave him Leah instead. After Leah's wedding week of seven days, Jacob received Rachel also, with the promise that he would serve seven more years for her (Gen. 29:27-29).	During this second seven year period, eleven of the patriarchs and Dinah were born to Laban's daughters (Gen. 31:43,50). At the end of the fourteen years, when Rachel was fully paid for, she bore Joseph, her first born child.	Jacob served six years for his cattle (Gen. 31:41). When they left Haran for Canaan, Rachel was heavy with child. Rachel's son Benjamin was born near Bethlehem. Dinah was six years old when they reached Canaan.



## IN THE SELFSAME DAY 430 YEARS AFTER ABRAM'S 75TH YEAR ISRAEL'S SOJOURNING WAS COMPLETED (EX. 12:40-41)

April 15, 1892 B.C., Abram entered Canaan. April 15, 1462 B.C., on the selfsame day, exactly 430 years later, the children of Israel departed from Rameses, Egypt (Num. 33:3). They sojourned half of that time in Canaan (215 years), and the other half of that time in Egypt (215 years). For their sojourning in Canaan, refer to Gen. 20:1; Gen. 21:34; Heb. 11:9. For their sojourning in Egypt, refer to Gen. 47:4; Deut. 26:5; Ps. 105:23; Acts 13:17.








So that the Lord "might dwell in their midst," he gave Moses detailed instructions as to how the Israelites should huild him a portable sanctuary. After three months the structure was finished. The heart of the sanctuary was the tabernacle (A) which housed the ark of the covenant, a chest containing the stone tablets of the law. Directly in front of the tabernacle was a bronze laver (B) for priests' ablutions during the ceremonies. Next came the altar (C) for burnt offerings. Linen curtains (D) on poles formed the courtyard.




## A Calendar of Feasts

April (Abib or Nisan) Israel's first month of the year (Ex. 12:2; 13:4; 23:15; 34:18; Neh. 2:1; Esther 3:7).  Ist day of every month is called beginnings of months or new moons, a day of feasting, blowing of trumpets for a memorial before your God (Num. 10:10; 28:11-14; Ps. 81:3).  10th day, the passover lamb is chosen (Ex. 12:3-5).  14th day, the passover is eaten in the evening. (Ex. 12:6-14; Lev. 23:5; Num. 9:2-5; 28:16; Ezek. 45:21).  15th to 21st was the feast of the passover. The first and last days of the feast, the 15th and 21st, were sabbath days, holy convocations, when no manner of work was to be done. All males 20 years old and upward must appear with a gift (Ex. 12:15-20; 23:14-17; Lev. 23:6-8; Num. 28:17-25; 2 Chr. 35:1).  21st is a solemn assembly (Deut. 16:1-8, 16-17).  [The 29th jubilee year, A.D. 29, Jesus died (page 57,62). He is our passover (1 Cor. 5:7), slain to set us free from sin (Matt 27:15; Mk. 15:6; Luke 23:17; John 18:39).]	May (Zif or Ziv) 2nd mo. (1 Ki. 6:1).  Ist day of the month, new moon celebration.  14th, the second passover is kept by those defiled by a dead body, or on a journey, when the first passover was kept (Num. 9:6-14).	June (Sivan) 3rd mo. (Esther 8:9).  1st day of the month, new moon celebration. Pentecost Sunday falls during June 3 thru 9, fifty days after passover sabbath (a Saturday), (Lev. 23:10-21; Deut. 16:9-10). It is also called the feast of harvest (Ex. 23:16), and the feast of weeks, of the first-fruits of wheat harvest (Ex. 34:22; Deut. 16:10). Each male must bring a gift (Deut. 16:16-17). Pentecost Sundays are circled in red (page 64).
July (Tammuz in the Jewish calendar is the 4th month).  1st day of the month, new moon celebration.	August (Ab Jewish cal.) the 5th mo. (Ezra 7:8-9).  1st day of the month, new moon celebration.	September (Elul) 6th mo. (Neh. 6:15).  Ist day of the month, new moon celebration.
October (Tishri in the Jewish calendar) 7th mo. (Ethanim; 1 Ki. 8:2).  Ist day, new moon celebration. Of the twelve new moons, October 1st is the only holy convocation feast (Lev. 23:24; Num. 29:1; Ps. 81:3).  10th day, the day of atonement, a day of afflicting the soul (fasting) (Lev. 16:29; Lev. 23:27,29,32). Every seventh year the law must be read before all Israel (Deut. 3i:9-13; Jer. 36:6).  10th day, every 49th year the trumpet of the jubilee is sounded (Lev. 25:9; Lev. 25; 8-55). All prisoners set free (Jer. 34:9).  15th to the 21st the feast of tabernacles or feast of ingathering. They shall dwell in booths seven days (Ex. 23:14-17; Lev. 23:34-44; Deut. 16:13-17; Neh. 8:14). All males 20 years old and upward must appear with a gift (Ex. 23:14-17; Deut. 16:16-17).  15th to 21st, the feast of tabernacles, special offerings are made each	November (Bul) 8th mo. (1 Ki. 6:38).  1st day of the month, new moon celebration.  God's 12-month calendar (1 Ki. 4:7 Rev. 22:2).	December (Chisleu) 9th mo. #### MT. SINAI AND VICINITY



The Sinaitic peninsula on the north, between the heads of the two gulfs, is 150 miles, the eastern side 130 miles, and the western side 190 miles. It is chiefly mountainous, most of which are naked rocks with narrow valleys. A narrow coastal plain runs along the Red Sea. Water is very scarce. It was well adapted to try the faith of Israel, and at the same time furnish ample opportunity to show God's power, and willingness to provide.

A land more desolate could not be found--water, food and protection had to be furnished by the Almighty. It stood in pointed contrast with Canaan, a land flowing with milk and honey which Israel would reach in twelve months time.

The mountains are lofty peaks of granite exhibiting a variety of colors, red, yellow, purple and green--making them objects of singular beauty when bathed in the light of a desert sun. They are all, however, naked and desolate. As the eye wanders over their riven sides and up their jagged peaks, not a tree, not a shrub, not a blade of grass is seen. Rugged passes, almost as bare and dry and desolate as the granity cliffs overhead, wind from the outer borders up into the center of the group. In the heart of these mountains, in nature's profoundest solitude, amid scenery unsurpassed for wild and stern grandeur, history, tradition and geography have combined to locate Sinai, "the mount of the Lord."


At Horeb, God had to give them water out of the bare rocks; in the wilderness of Sin, food had to be given from heaven; at Rephidim, the tired, hungry and thirsty Israelites fought Amalek. No wonder they said, "Were there no graves in Egypt, that you brought us out here to die?" But, man's extremity is God's opportunity. What better place could Providence have appointed to show His power?

Then came Sinai--Israel assembled on a small plain surrounded by giant peaks with their granite heads piercing the sky. Before them Sinai grew with a blanket of dense cloud, lightening shot her arrows between the jagged peaks, thunders rolled, the earth shook, fire burned--God had made his appearance--his thunderous voice reverberated through the narrow passes--Israel feared and quaked!


1461 B.C., MAY 20TH, ISRAEL DEPARTED FROM SINAI



#### SACRIFICES

- 1. BURNT OFFERINGS: A sacrifice burned on the alter--symbolized worship of adoration, devotion, dedication, supplication & expiation.
- 2. SIN OFFERINGS: An expiatory offering to restore covenant relations with God.
- 3. TRESPASS OFFERINGS: An offering dealing with offences against God or man, that may be estimated by money value, to compensate for damages.
- 4. PEACE OFFERINGS: An offering to express or promote friendly relations with God.
- 5. THANKS OFFERINGS: An offering to express thanksgiving or gratitude for blessings received.
- 6. FREE-WILL OFFERINGS: An offering made out of an overflowing heart.
- 7. MEAT (MEAL) OFFERINGS: An offering of cereals or flour baked with oil and frankincense--a token of friendship, an act of homage, tribute--to procure favors.
- 8. WAVE OFFERINGS: An offering that is waved to and from the alter, signifying the giving back by God, who had received the peace offering, to the offerer or the priest.
- 9. HEAVE OFFERINGS: An offering that is lifted up and down from the alter

  --a shoulder or thigh--separated to the service of God for
  the priests. Presented to God and received back.
- 10. OBLATIONS: Animals, vegetables, or money--what is brought near as a gift to God.
- 11. FIRE OFFERINGS: A gift presented through fire to God as food.
- 12. DRINK OFFERINGS: An offering of wine to accompany the burnt offering.
- 13. FEASTS: The eating of the meat of the sacrifices as service to God.
- 14. FRANKINCENSE: Incense used with meal offerings and burnt offerings, also burned on the golden altar.
- 15. SALT: Used in all sacrifices to make it savory, and to purify and preserve.
- In the NEW TESTAMENT words used concerning sacrifices and their benefits are: Redemption, Offering, Ransom, Reconciliation, Forgiveness, Propitiation and Atonement.

#### FABULOUS FACTS AND FIGURES

One of the biggest arithmetical miracles in the world - Moses and the people of Israel were in the desert, but what was he going to do with them? They had to be fed, and feeding 3 to  $3\frac{1}{2}$  million people would require a lot of food.

According to the Quarter-Master General in the Army, it is reported that Moses would have to have 1,500 tons of food each day. Do you know that to bring that much food each day, two freight trains, each a mile long, would be required?

Besides, you must remember, they were out in the desert, and they would have to have firewood for use in cooking the food. This would take 4,000 tons of wood and a few more freight trains, each a mile long, just for one day. And just think they were 40 years in transit.

Then they would have to have water. If they only had enough to drink and wash a few dishes, it would take 1,000,000 gallons each day which would be the equivalent of a freight train of tank cars 1,800 miles long just to bring water. They had no lakes, and only a few wells. How did they get that much water?

Another thing, they had to get across the Red Sea in one night. Now if they went on a narrow part, double file, the line would be 800 miles long and would take 35 days and nights to get through. So there had to be a space in the Red Sea 3 miles wide and they would have to walk across 5,000 abreast to get over in one night.


But then, another problem. Every time they camped at the end of the day, a campground 2/3 the size of the state of Rhode Island, or a total of 750 square miles, was needed. That comprises an area of 25 miles wide and 30 miles long. Think of it, this space just for nightly camping.


Did Moses figure all this out before they left Egypt? I think not.

Solomon's Temple was designed by a Tyrian architect (I Kings 7:13-15) and is comparable with structures of the period between 1200 and 900 BC.

The temple itself, measuring 100 by 30 feet, was erected on a nine foot platform which was about 7 1/2 feet wider than the building. The temple was approached by ten steps, at the top of which were two free standing pillars such as were used in Phoenicia and Syria. Between the pillars were high doors which led into a vestibule or entrance porch. A set of double doors, 33 by 15 feet, opened into the Holy Place which measured 60 by 30 feet and was 45 feet high and illuminated by high clerestory windows below the ceiling. The walls, floors, and doors of the Holy Place were lined with wood and overlaid with gold. Beyond further steps a door led to the Holy of Holies, or Most Holy Place, a room without windows in the shape of a thirty foot cube. This was the throne room of Israel's God. It was dominated by gilded cherubim, fifteen feet high, over the Mercy Seat which formed the cover to the sacred Ark of the Covenant.

## **NEW TESTAMENT STUDIES**

HOW MATTHEW'S AND LUKE'S GENEALOGIES OF CHRIST DIFFER:

From Abraham to David, their genealogies are identical. Then Luke follows the priestly lineage. The royal and priestly families intermarried several times. Their first merging was when Aaron, the first high priest, married into royalty. He married Elisheba, a daughter of Judah (Exo. 6:23). Elisheba's brother, Naashon, carried on the royal lineage (Matt. 1:4).

Another example of the uniting of the two families occurred when David married Bathsheba, a descendent of Levi. Luke's account lists several priests. Joseph, of Judah's family, married Mary of Aaron's family. Mary was a descendent of Aaron as was her cousin Elizabeth (Luke 1:5 & 36).
