- G. God's word will stand forever and judge us at last.

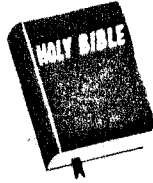
II. We Should

- C. Causing man to believe his conscience is a safe guide.
- D. Causing him to have blind faith in preachers.
- E. Encouraging him to make his own choice.
- F. Through religious division and confusion.
- G. Through sinful pleasures.

*Note the Lord's warnings - Prov. 14:12; Mt. 15:13; 2 Thess. 2:10-12.

II. This Blindness Can Be Avoided

- A. Paul says we are not ignorant of his devices.
- B. Hear, Heed and Speak as the oracles of God. Walk by faith.
- C. Believe the Bible teaching on the church and through loving faith obey the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- D. This is done by hearing, believing, repenting, confessing and being baptized for the remission of sins.
- E. We must remain faithful to the Lord all our days.

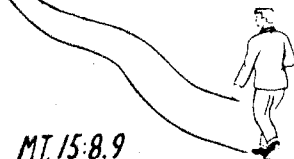

 - B. Man depends on greater numbers in manpower and equipment.
 - II. Ruling Men
 - A. God chose judges to rule His people.
 - B. Israel wanted kings like the nations about them.
 - III. The Amalekites
 - A. God commanded them to be utterly destroyed.
 - B. Saul and the people had a "special sacrifice" in mind.
 - IV. David And Goliath
 - A. Where is the human wisdom in sending a lad against a giant.
 - B. David believed in God -- the giant in his superior size, strength and weapons.
 - V. Plan Of Salvation
 - A. God's plan calls for simple faith and obedience.
 - B. Man doesn't see it this way so makes his own plans.
 - VI. The Church
 - A. God has a plan for His church as to government, worship and work.
 - B. Much of God's plan doesn't appeal to man's "wisdom", even some brethren.
 - VII. Individual Responsibility
 - A. God wants to activate the individual.
 - B. Man seems anxious to share his own responsibilities with others.

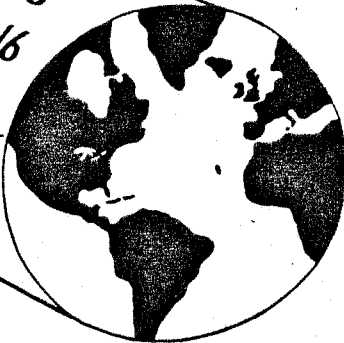

HOW SHOULD I GIVE?

1. Scriptural giving needed as well as scriptural baptism.
2. Let us learn from examples in the Old Testament.

I. Giving In Old Testament Times

- A. Abraham and Jacob gave a tenth.
- B. Israel gave a tenth for the support of the Levites.
- C. They gave the firstlings of their beasts -- made burnt, meat, peace, sin, trespass and free will offerings.
- D. In addition as individuals they were to provide for the poor (brethren and strangers). This individual action - corners of fields, gleanings, yield of seventh year, no usury to be charged brethren, poor released from debt seventh year and the tithe for the poor the third.
(This seems to be a third tithe - see Josephus Ant. IV, 8:22.)
- F. Some robbed God.

II. Instructions To Christians

- A. We are told to lay up treasure in heaven. God provides for His children. Our bodies to be given to the Lord. Preachers to be supported.
- B. Provisions made for the poor - relief to needy brethren, contributions and collections for poor saints. This ministering can be done by the church through purposeful, liberal giving. God will provide for needs of His people. Note carefully 2 Cor. 9:6-8.
- C. Individuals to assist poor also - own relatives, do good to all, visit fatherless and widows in afflictions.
- D. Our opportunities and ability determine our responsibility.

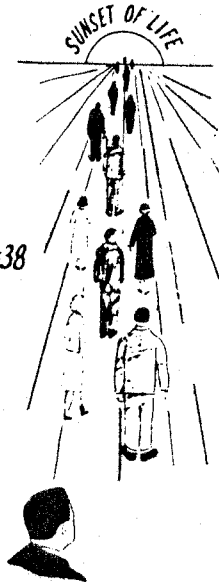

1. Study examples of men with little faith and see what it did for them.
2. Such should make us ashamed of our lack of faith in God.

I. Results Of Little Faith

- A. A lack of faith by Jacob caused him to fear for his life and those of his family at the hand of Esau in spite of God's promise to him.
- B. Because of lack of faith the Israelites were denied the promise land.
- C. One man was trode to death for disbelieving God's ability to provide plenty in time of great famine as Elisha prophesied.
- D. The disciples of Christ were afraid in the great tempest with Him.
- E. Peter began to sink while walking on the water to Jesus when his faith failed him.

II. Many Are Now Of Little Faith

- A. Those who follow human creeds show a lack of faith in God to give man a complete and sufficient guide.
- B. Those who change God's ways to their own ways show more faith in themselves than in God.
- C. Those who turn to human philosophies show a lack of faith in God and in His word.
- D. Those anxious to provide an abundance of material things for themselves show a lack of faith in God to provide man's needs.
- E. Those who are not liberal in supporting the Lord's work show that they don't believe that God can and will do what He says.

PREACHING WITHOUT PROFIT

Heb. 4:2

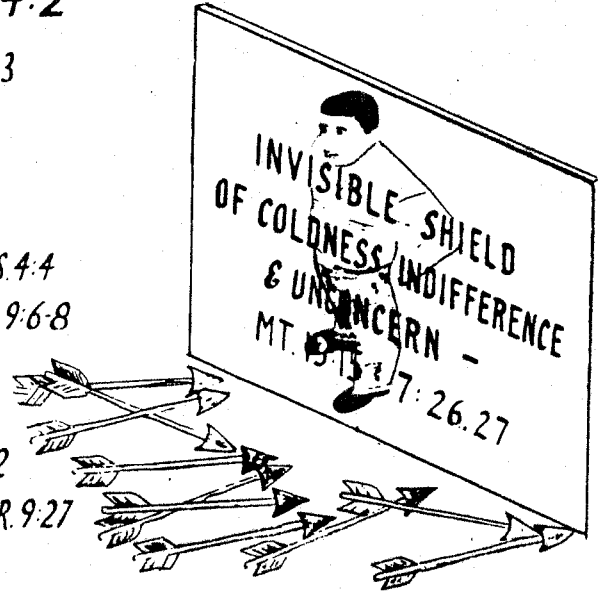
1. It is most discouraging to see the lack of application of faithful gospel preaching in the lives of many who hear the truth.
2. Many seem to stand behind an invisible shield of coldness, indifference and unconcern, shielding off the arrows of truth aimed at their hearts.
 - I. Truths Are Often Preached Without Profit - Not Mixed With Faith
 - A. Put first things first - so many just won't do this.
 - B. Importance of attendance - many refuse to be faithful.
 - C. Need of faithfulness - some won't be good workers.
 - D. Warning against neglectfulness - such frequently ignored.
 - E. Need for godliness - too many enticements in the world.
 - F. Need for liberality - can't gratify own wants which are put first.
 - G. Be doers of will - too many other things to do.
 - H. Need for teaching others - "Not qualified" - and not qualifying.
 - I. Individual responsibility - desire for others to help me with my duty.
 - J. Warning against apostasy - been baptized - member of the church so not worried. Preachers and elders ought to be concerned about unbaptized.

II. All Issues Can Be Resolved

- A. Jesus gave the solution - LOVE OF GOD - Mk. 12:29,30.
- B. Study carefully this love and what it will do.
- C. Such love will cause us to be God's servants.
 1. Ready to hear His way, not our own - desiring to please Him, not ourselves - anxious to obey Him, not the ideas of men - and faithful in duty to Him, knowing even then we are unprofitable servants.
 2. Love His truth and grow in knowledge of it.
 3. Have faith in His word as being complete and sufficient, not supposing that we can add improvements to it.
 4. Speak and act by His authority, not by that of ambitious men.
 5. Love His children -- such love will not try to hurt or destroy them. Note the characteristics of this love - 1 Cor. 13:4-6.
- D. To resolve the issues we must walk by the same rule -- God's word, not plans of men and all speak the same things deriving authority from the same source -- The Bible.

II. For The Safety Of Man's Soul Christ Provides These Needs

- A. He points out man's helplessness without Him and his need of readiness.
- B. He is the Shelter for soul survival and will give protection.
- C. We are kept by our faith in Him and are sustained by Him as the Water of life and Bread of heaven.

II. Unto The Doctrine

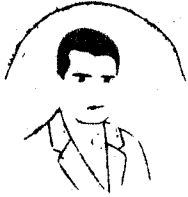

- A. The church has an obligation toward widows indeed.
 - B. Examples are given of the early church providing for needy saints.
 - C. Christians have obligations to parents - to provide for their own (relatives) that the church be not charged with responsibilities of individuals.
 - D. Individual Christians to visit (assist, oversee) afflicted widows and orphans and to entertain strangers.

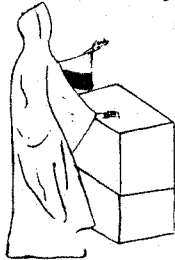
